- 1. Auschwitz-Birkenau, is the most infamous of the Nazi death camps. It was a massive concentration, forced labour and extermination camp at the centre of a network of more than 40 satellite camps.
- 2.Upwards of 80 per cent of those Jews transported to Auschwitz-Birkenau were selected for immediate death. The remainder was selected for work. The majority of those selected for work died within a few weeks or months of their arrival at the camp as a result of overwork, ill treatment, disease or lack of food.
- 3. Overwork, ill treatment, disease, and lack of food.
- 4.One of the most pivotal actors in the deportation of European Jewry during the Holocaust, Adolf Eichmann (1906–1962) was born in Solingen, Germany, on March 19, 1906.
- 5.In August 1933, Eichmann joined the "Austrian Legion".
- 6.An association organized in Bavaria for unemployed Nazi Party members from Austria.
- 7.In 1940, plans were devised by the Nazis to ship all Jews under Nazi control to Madagascar, an island in the Indian Ocean.
- 8. Chelmno was the site of the first gassing of Jews, which occurred on December 8, 1941.
- 9. Deportation was the first step in the "Final Solution."
